

# Checklist for your print layout

## Offsetprint and Digital print

- Print layout has to be saved as a **PDF file (Standard PDF/X-3:2002)**
- Dieline** has to be created as a **full-tone color** with 100% and set to **overprint**
- All **fonts** must be converted into **paths**
- Colors must be set using the **CMYK**-mode
- PANTONE** colors have to be created and define as such
- The **resolution** of all elements and images must be at least **300 dpi**
- If a **bleed** is noted, please implement this into the print layout

## Screen print and Pad print

- Print layout has to be saved as a **PDF file (Standard PDF/X-3:2002)**
- Dieline** has to be created as a **full-tone color** with 100% and set to **overprint**
- All **fonts and images** must be converted into **paths**
- PANTONE** colors have to be created and define as such
- The **resolution** of all elements and images must be at least **300 dpi**
- All colors must be set as **spot colors** - no gradients possible

*The printing inks do not necessarily come out the way they do on the color card. Color deviations are also possible with fixed Pantone tones. For dark fabrics (e.g. black, dark blue, dark green) the print should be set onto a white background. This is then another printing color.*

**NOTE: If a too low resolution was used in your print data or the data was not created according to our specifications, we cannot guarantee a clean and high-quality print result!**
